**DEFAULT JUDGMENT
PERMANENTLY ENJOINING
DEFENDANTS
FROM PRACTICING DENTISTRY**

This matter came before the undersigned Superior Court Judge upon Motion of the North Carolina State Board of Dental Examiners (“Dental Board”) pursuant to Rule 55(b)(2)b of the North Carolina Rules of Civil Procedure for a Default Judgment.

1. The Summons and Verified Complaint for Permanent Injunction with its supporting affidavit were filed in this action on May 8, 2023.
2. The Verified Complaint for Permanent Injunction states that the Dental Board brought this action pursuant to the authority granted under Chapter 90 of the North Carolina General Statutes, including N.C. Gen. Stat. §§ 90-22, 90-29, 90-40, and 90-40.1.
3. The Verified Complaint for Permanent Injunction states that Defendants have engaged in the unlicensed practice of dentistry including by:
 - a. treating a deformity, injury, deficiency, defect, or other physical condition of the human teeth including providing repairs of chipped teeth, broken teeth, or gaps in teeth;
 - b. cleaning teeth and applying professional grade teeth whitening solution containing more than 10% hydrogen peroxide or 22% carbamide peroxide to remove stains, accretions, or deposits from human teeth;

- c. performing operations, or a phase of them, relative or incident to the replacement or restoration of human teeth with any artificial substance, material, or device, including bonding composite resin to restore and change the shape or structure of human teeth;
 - d. making, constructing, furnishing, processing, repairing, adjusting, or supplying appliances designed to replace lost or missing human teeth without a work order from a licensed dentist, including constructing, supplying, and repairing bridges;
 - e. placing in the human mouth appliances designed to replace lost or missing human teeth, including bridges;
 - f. repairing or adjusting appliances designed as an aid in the treatment of the malposition or malformation of a tooth or teeth, including removing braces;
 - g. owning, managing, controlling, and conducting an enterprise, Magnified Beauty, wherein the aforementioned acts are done or represented to be done; and
 - h. claiming and advertising to the public the ability to do the aforementioned acts and to provide training to other persons to do one or more of the aforementioned acts, including on the website www.magnifiedbeautycosmetics.com and on Facebook.com.
4. Copies of the Summons and Verified Complaint for Permanent Injunction were served on Defendants by the Edgecombe County Sheriff's Department on May 16, 2023.
 5. Defendants have not filed or served an answer or otherwise appeared in the action.
 6. Defendants are neither infants nor incompetent persons.
 7. On June 27, 2023, the Clerk of Superior Court entered default against Defendants pursuant to Rule 55(a) of the North Carolina Rules of Civil Procedure.
 8. On July 17, 2023, the Dental Board filed a Motion for Default Judgment pursuant to Rule 55(b)(2)b of the North Carolina Rules of Civil Procedure, with a Certificate of Service certifying that Defendants were served a copy of the Motion that same day.
 9. In accordance with Rule 55(b)(2)b, the Motion notified Defendants of the Dental Board's request that the Court decide the Motion for Default Judgment without a

hearing if Defendants failed to serve a written response, stating the grounds for opposing the Motion, within 30 days of service of the Motion.

10. Defendants did not file or serve a written response, stating the grounds for opposing the Dental Board's Motion, within 30 days after service of the Motion.

Based on the foregoing findings, this Court concludes:

1. The Dental Board has the authority to bring this proceeding pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. §§ 90-22, 90-29, 90-40, and 90-40.1.
2. The Court has jurisdiction over the subject matter of this action pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. § 90-40.1.
3. The Dental Board's Motion for Default Judgment is properly before this Court pursuant to Rule 55(b)(2) of the North Carolina Rules of Civil Procedure.
4. The Dental Board is entitled to the relief requested in its Verified Complaint for Permanent Injunction, seeking an Order enjoining Defendants from engaging in the unlicensed practice of dentistry by:
 - a. treating a deformity, injury, deficiency, defect, or other physical condition of the human teeth including providing repairs of chipped teeth, broken teeth, or gaps in teeth;
 - b. cleaning teeth and applying professional grade teeth whitening solution containing more than 10% hydrogen peroxide or 22% carbamide peroxide to remove stains, accretions, or deposits from human teeth;
 - c. performing operations, or a phase of them, relative or incident to the replacement or restoration of human teeth with any artificial substance, material, or device, including bonding composite resin to restore and change the shape or structure of human teeth;
 - d. making, constructing, furnishing, processing, repairing, adjusting, or supplying appliances designed to replace lost or missing human teeth without a work order

from a licensed dentist, including constructing, supplying, and repairing bridges;

- e. placing in the human mouth appliances designed to replace lost or missing human teeth, including bridges;
- f. repairing or adjusting appliances designed as an aid in the treatment of the malposition or malformation of a tooth or teeth, including removing braces;
- g. owning, managing, controlling, and conducting an enterprise, Magnified Beauty, wherein the aforementioned acts are done or represented to be done; and
- h. claiming and advertising to the public the ability to do the aforementioned acts and to provide training to other persons to do the aforementioned acts, including on the website www.magnifiedbeautycosmetics.com and on Facebook.com.

IT IS NOW, THEREFORE, ORDERED AS FOLLOWS:

Defendants and any affiliates, related entities or successors, their officers, agents, servants, employees, directors, or others acting in concert or participation with them are permanently enjoined from engaging in the unlicensed practice of dentistry in North Carolina, including:

- a) treating a deformity, injury, deficiency, defect, or other physical condition of the human teeth including providing repairs of chipped teeth, broken teeth, or gaps in teeth;
- b) cleaning teeth and applying professional grade teeth whitening solution containing more than 10% hydrogen peroxide or 22% carbamide peroxide to remove stains, accretions, or deposits from human teeth;
- c) performing operations, or a phase of them, relative or incident to the replacement or restoration of human teeth with any artificial substance, material, or device, including bonding composite resin to restore and change the shape or structure of human teeth;
- d) making, constructing, furnishing, processing, repairing, adjusting, or supplying appliances designed to replace lost or missing human teeth, including constructing, supplying, and repairing bridges, unless it is done

pursuant to a specific work order issued to Defendants for a particular patient by a dentist actively licensed in North Carolina;

- e) placing in the human mouth appliances designed to replace lost or missing human teeth, including bridges;
- f) repairing or adjusting appliances designed as an aid in the treatment of the malposition or malformation of a tooth or teeth, including removing braces;
- g) owning, managing, controlling, and conducting an enterprise wherein any of the acts or practices set forth in N.C. Gen. Stat. § 90-29(b)(1)-(10) are done, attempted to be done, or represented to be done;
- h) representing to the public, by any advertisement or announcement, the ability or qualification to do or perform, or to provide training to other persons to do or perform, any of the acts or practices set forth in N.C. Gen. Stat. § 90-29(b)(1)-(10); and
- i) engaging in any other act constituting the practice of dentistry in North Carolina until such time, if ever, that Defendant Jones is the holder of a license issued by the Dental Board and currently in effect.
