Applicants may take reexamination in accordance with Rule .0317 of this Section. 6 (b) All applicants for dental licensure shall achieve passing scores on the examination administered by the Joint 7 Commission on National Dental Examinations and clinical examinations administered by Board approved testing 8 agencies. The Board shall determine which testing agencies are approved based on the requirements set forth in 9 Paragraphs (c) and (d) of this Rule. 10 (c) To qualify as an approved testing agency, the test-development agencies shall allow a representative of the Board 11 to serve on the Board of Directors and the Examination Review Committee of the agency, agency and allow Board 12 input in the examination development and administration. 13 (d) To qualify as an approved testing agency, the clinical examination administered by a testing agency shall: 14 (1) include procedures performed on human subjects or an alternative method that simulates human 15 subjects, including manikins, as part of the assessment of restorative clinical competencies; 16 (2) include evaluations in clinical periodontics and at least three of the following subject matter areas: 17 endodontics, clinical abilities testing; (A) 18 (B) amalgam preparation and restoration; 19 anterior composite preparation and restoration; (C) 20 (D) posterior ceramic or composite preparation and restoration; 21 (E) prosthetics, written or clinical abilities testing; 22 (F) oral diagnosis, written or clinical abilities testing; or 23 (G) oral surgery, written or clinical abilities testing; and 24 (3) provide the following: 25 anonymity between applicants and examination graders; (A) 26 (B) standardization and calibration of graders; 27 (C) a mechanism for post exam analysis; 28 (D) conjunctive scoring, which is scoring that requires applicants to earn a passing grade on all 29 sections or areas tested and that does not allow weighted, averaged, or overall scoring to 30 compensate for failures in individual subject areas; (E) 31 a minimum passing score set by the testing agency for each subject area tested; 32 (F) an annual review of the examination; 33 a task analysis performed at least once every seven years, that surveys dentists nationwide (G) 34 to determine the content of the examination; 35 (H) a system of quality assurance to ensure uniform, consistent administration of the 36 examination at each testing site; and
